For many years she was nominated and also acted as the Delegate from Eusko Etxea of New York to the North American Basque Organization

(NABO) where she attended their Annual Conferences. She also took Euskara Classes taught at Esuko Etxea and in particular Itziar Albisu, a former President of Eusko Etxea and would go so far as to go to Itziar's house for personal lessons. She involved family & friends in many of her endeavors in her log time participation in Eusko Etxea.

Her work as a VP at Deutsche Bank,s New York Headquarters led her to also teach courses on International Banking at NYU.

During recent years, during which time she battled her episodes with cancer ups and downs, she fulfilled her Bucket List and traveled the world far and wide. It was always a pleasure to hear of her adventures as it always brightened her face.
